PROCLAMATION

Declaring November 18, 2021 as World Pancreatic Cancer Day in the Town of Clinton, Connecticut

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, currently the 3rd leading cause of cancer-related death in the United States surpassing breast cancer; and

WHEREAS Pancreatic cancer has the lowest five-year survival rate of all major cancers at just 10 percent; and

WHEREAS when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally in later stages, and only 10 percent of pancreatic cancer patients are diagnosed when the disease is confined to their pancreas, and 91 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years; and

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is the seventh most common cause of cancer-related death across the world; and

WHEREAS the good health and well-being of the residents of Clinton are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about the symptoms and risks of pancreatic cancer, and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Clinton Town Council hereby designates November 18, 2021 as World Pancreatic Cancer Day in the Town of Clinton, Connecticut.
