Old Saybrook Police Commission

Regular Meeting March 24, 2025 MINUTES

A regular hybrid meeting of the Old Saybrook Police Commission was held on Monday, March 24, 2025. The meeting was recorded and can be viewed in its entirety at https://youtu.be/LswHObso3xk

Present: Chairman Wilcox, Vice Chairman Shippee, Secretary Notar-Francesco, Commissioners Von Dassel and Ciliano. Commissioner Calle was present virtually. Commissioner Prast was unable to attend. Chief Spera was present from the Department of Police Services.

I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Pledge of Allegiance (0:20)

Chairman Wilcox called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM, took a roll call and led those in attendance with the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Comments from the Public (1:20)

Mike Looney commented.

Mark (no last name given) commented.

III. Discussion and Possible Action on the Meeting Minutes for: (3:01)

a. Regular Meeting - February 24, 2025 (3:04)

Secretary Notar-Francesco made a motion to approve the February 24, 2025 Regular Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Ciliano seconded the motion. The motion to approve the minutes passed with a vote of 6 in favor, 0 opposed and 0 abstaining.

b. **Special Meeting - March 6, 2025 (3:28)**

Secretary Notar-Francesco made a motion to approve the March 6, 2025 Special Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Ciliano seconded the motion. The motion to approve the minutes passed with a vote of 6 in favor, 0 opposed and 0 abstaining.

IV. Correspondence (3:49)

Chairman Wilcox stated that he had nothing to report other than what was already circulated.

V. Executive Reports (4:00)

a. FY 25 Operating Budget (4:06)

Chief Spera stated that the normal documentation for the on-budget and off-budget accounts were provided.

There were no questions from Commissioners.

b. FY 2026 Budget Process (4:37)

Chief Spera thanked the Commissioners who showed up for the Town Meeting on the budget. He stated that he doesn't believe there was any action taken on the Police Department budget that night.

Board of Finance member Paul Carver was in attendance and confirmed that was correct. Mr. Carver stated that the next meeting was April 1st.

c. Off Budget Accounts (5:25)

The Commission had no questions.

d. Personnel Matters (5:34)

Chief Spera stated that trainees Fox and Rankin graduate this week from the Police Academy, after that they will attend the OSPD Academy. Chief Spera stated that the two will have to take Emergency Medical Responder classes as the academy no longer provides that training.

Chief Spera stated that Sergeant Ciccone still remains out on his work-related medical leave and that he is anticipating another month out.

e. Professional Development Update (8:34)

Chief Spera stated that the two new Sergeants recently finished First Line Supervisor School and they have been field training for the past week. They should be on their own within the next week or so.

f. Activity Report (9:22)

Chief Spera advised the Commission that he sent over a couple different revised reports to meet their request. He stated that he was interested in feedback from the Commission. He stated that he cannot adjust this report easily. It has to be someone from the CAD vendor to adjust the report.

Secretary Notar-Francesco stated that the report was hard to follow and that she was looking for something much simpler.

Chief Spera asked if giving the Commission the 2024 year-end report and the current year's updated report.

Secretary Notar-Francesco stated that, yes, that would work for her.

g. <u>PERF Recommendations – Draft Department Action Plan (13:18)</u>

Chief Spera stated that he put together a draft department action plan about the PERF report recommendations. He stated that he listed all 31 recommendations in this plan. He feels that this must be a very transparent process, and that everything should be documented and hyperlinked to PDF

documents that support the work. Chief Spera stated that he was very interested in feedback from the Commission regarding this document.

The Commission thanked the Chief for the draft and stated that they would look over the report and get back to him with suggestions.

Chief Spera stated that April is Autism Awareness Month and that there will be ribbons on the cars and pins that the Patrol Officers will be wearing on their uniforms.

Chief Spera stated that, as part of his executive goals, he has planned a car seat clinic to take place in September. Patrol Officer Kostek is working on updating the forms, getting updated equipment and creating a flyer to advertise this benefit. Chief Spera stated that a new email address has been created to streamline the car seat install requests.

VI. <u>Discussion and Possible Action Concerning Golf Cart Registration Fees for the 2025-2026</u> Season (19:16)

Chief Spera suggested to the Commission keeping the same registration fees as the previous years: \$25 for the first plate, \$20 for the second plate and \$15 for the third should they all be registered to the same address and \$45 for vanity plates.

Secretary Notar-Francesco suggested that the Commission make it a \$25 flat fee for all golf carts plates removing any discount for multiple golf carts registered to an address. She agreed with keeping the vanity plates \$45. She stated that this is not an effort to raise revenue but to keep cost consistent.

The Commission agreed.

Secretary Notar-Francesco made a motion to adopt the fee schedule for golf cart registration fees for \$25 per golf cart and \$45 per vanity plate. The cost associated with postage and/or credit card fees will be paid by the consumer. Commissioner Ciliano seconded the motion.

Commissioner Ciliano asked if there was a better way to patrol kids driving the golf carts.

Chief Spera stated that he would be holding a leadership team meeting tomorrow in which he will bring it up. He stated that his directive will be to stop and talk to anyone before taking enforcement.

The motion passed with a vote of 6 in favor, 0 opposed and 0 abstaining.

VII. <u>Discussion with Attorney Berchem and Possible Action Regarding a New Bylaw (25:28)</u>

Chairman Wilcox stated that he asked Attorney Berchem attend the meeting to address this proposal that the Commission worked on almost three years ago regarding the Citizen Complaints bylaw.

Attorney Berchem stated that he worked on this with the Chief of Police and Chairman Wilcox three years ago. The background is that the bylaw needs to comply with state statues. If the complaint focuses on a Chief of Police, the Chief is involved and responsible for issuing a control number for the complaint.

Chairman Wilcox stated that there are different versions of Section 4. The Commission originally adopted the version in which, in the instance there is a complaint about the Chief of Police, the Commission would decide how the complaint would be investigated. Chairman Wilcox stated that this proposed bylaw is different.

Attorney Berchem stated that this proposed version protects the Commission against any preadjudication by forwarding the complaint to the Board of Selectmen.

Chairman Wilcox read from page 76 in the PERF report. "The Police Commission must play a stronger role in overseeing the department. More importantly, the Commission must ensure all allegations of misconduct against the police department's members – including the police chief – are fully investigated."

Chairman Wilcox asked Attorney Berchem if this new version is a step in that direction. Attorney Berchem stated that he feels that his bylaw does that.

Commissioner Calle expressed her concern about the process when receiving an oral complaint. The Commission discussed this and decided that is a valid concern but premature. The process can be developed following adoption.

Chief Spera stated that there is a current directive that the Police Commission had issued to him. He stated that the current policy had a threshold on the type of complaint. This proposed one doesn't. He also stated that the current policy has different methods to resolve the complaints, this new one doesn't. He stated that he wanted to make sure that they are not removing different methods that one can use to resolve civilian complaints.

Attorney Berchem suggested changing the words "shall" to "may." It gives discretion to whom the complaint goes to. He stated that the important part is that it is received and how you react after.

Chairman Wilcox stated that his concern with the word "may" implies that it may do something else too.

Chief Spera stated that he is concerned that this could possibly cause an issue. He asked Attorney Berchem what his thoughts were on making thresholds for the complaints like the state does.

Chairman Wilcox stated that he feels that the Board of Selectman should be the ones who decide if this is a frivolous complaint or not.

Chief Spera stated his concern that the Board of Selectmen must give notice, meet, notice the employee and so on. The key is that the Police Commission cannot be the investigator and adjudicator. Chief Spera stated that this bylaw is taking oversight authority away from the Commission and passing it to the Board of Selectman.

Chairman Wilcox stated that in the original version the Police Commission decided how an investigation will be conducted. He stated that he is trying to tailor this to fit PERF's suggestions. This original bylaw was rescinded.

Chief Spera stated that with this proposed bylaw the Police Commission is not the decider. This new bylaw states that you must pass it on.

Attorney Berchem will return to the Commission with suggestions based on the discussion.

Commissioner Ciliano made a motion to table this agenda item until next month. Secretary Notar-Francesco seconded the motion. The motion to table this agenda item passed with a vote of 6 in favor, 0 opposed and 0 abstaining.

Special Meeting March 31, 2025 MINUTES

A special hybrid meeting of the Old Saybrook Police Commission was held on Monday, March 31, 2025. The meeting was recorded and can be viewed in its entirety at https://youtu.be/N5UlvBSXAOO

Present: Chairman Wilcox, Vice Chairman Shippee, Secretary Notar-Francesco, Commissioners Von Dassel, Prast, Calle and Ciliano. First Selectman Fortuna was present from the Board of Selectmen, as exofficio.

I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Pledge of Allegiance (0:22)

Chairman Wilcox called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM, did a roll call, and led those in attendance with the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Comments from the Public (1:06)

Linda Mahal commented.

III. <u>Discussion and Possible Action on a process for engaging a search firm (4:13)</u>

Chairman Wilcox made a motion that a subcommittee be formed consisting of Vice Chairman Shippee, Secretary Notar-Francesco and Commissioner Prast for the purposes of interview and reporting back to the Commission on the references supplied by search firms interested in assisting the Commission with its efforts to identify and engage a new Chief of Police. The subcommittee is authorized to use its discretion in identifying references its members interview and questions its members ask. Secretary Notar-Francesco seconded the motion.

The Commission discussed the motion.

Chairman Wilcox stated that five firms are interested in helping find the next Chief of Police. He advised the Commission that First Selectman Fortuna solicited these firms.

Chairman Wilcox handed out to the Commission list of questions that the subcommittee might want to ask.

First Selectman Fortuna stated that five are in front of the Commission, but there might still be one or two more coming. He stated that PERF does this and they may or may not want to submit a bid. He explained to the Commission how the five were solicited. First Selectman Fortuna stated that Chief Spera recommended three. The three he recommended are International Association of Chiefs of Police, Baker Tilly and PERF. First Selectman Fortuna stated that he reached out to them today. The town attorney suggested, Badge Quest, the First Selectman reached out to them, and they submitted a proposal. A former Chief of Police suggested a company and attorney Eric Daigle reached out saying that he does this type of consulting too.

Commissioner Ciliano stated that he feels that the subcommittee should trim the list down to the top three and bring that back to the Commission.

Commissioner Calle stated that the whole Commission can deal with this as they have gotten together a lot in the past couple of months and gotten a lot accomplished.

Secretary Notar-Francesco stated that the task for the subcommittee is clearly defined. The only charge for the subcommittee is to make the calls for references. The full Commission has all proposals and will come back together, with the information from the subcommittee, and decide whom to interview.

Vice Chair Shippee stated that she was under the impression that the subcommittee would make the recommendations to the Commission on what companies to interview.

Chairman Wilcox stated that the full Commission will decide on who they want to interview.

Vice Chair Shippee questioned that the subcommittee will only be tasked with looking into references only.

Chairman Wilcox stated he has looked at the most expeditious way to do this. He stated that he doesn't want to spend two weeks checking references and that the subcommittee will report back to the Commission on the reference checks. He stated that some may be excellent candidates and some may not be. The full Commission can make that call.

Commissioner Calle stated that she just wanted to be clear that the full Commission will hire the Chief of Police. Chairman Wilcox stated that is correct. He stated that the First Selectman will not have a vote, but does have a voice.

Vice Chair Shippee stated that she thought the subcommittee would do the reference checks and narrow the list down to two or three.

Chairman Wilcox stated that they will just be reporting the results back.

Commissioner Ciliano stated that he thinks that they should come back with three not all.

Secretary Notar-Francesco stated that nothing is preventing the subcommittee from suggesting the top

The motion passed with a vote of 7 in favor, 0 opposed and 0 abstaining.

The Commission discussed on when to meet next.

Secretary Notar-Francesco asked if the subcommittee can meet on Wednesday and decide on questions. Each firm should be asked the same questions.

Chairman Wilcox stated that he spoke with attorney John Berchem and these the meetings are exempt in the FOI rules and that the subcommittee is part of that. He stated that the Commission can meet and not have it be a public meeting.

Vice Chair Shippee reconfirmed that the Chairman was speaking about the subcommittee meetings.

The Chairman stated "yes".

First Selectman Fortuna said that at the end of the day there might be six or seven bids. It is likely that three to four could possibly be a fit. He stated that one way is to rate the proposals, do interviews and then do reference checks. He stated that the Commission could possibly just look at the proposals and eliminate a couple right away. He is happy to assist on whatever the Commission chooses.

Chairman Wilcox stated that the Commission has not had enough time to review the proposals. He said that, while the subcommittee is working, he is hopeful Commissioners will be reading these proposals.

Commissioner Calle asked if the Commission could get together and deep dive into the bids they have and rate them. She stated that she feels like it would work. Chairman Wilcox stated that the Commission will get together and that each Commissioner should come with a rank order.

The full Commission decided to meet on Monday April 7th at 6:30 PM. The subcommittee will meet Wednesday April 2nd at 6 PM.
